What is BookBrowse for Libraries?

BookBrowse is a unique blend of an online magazine, book review and readers' advisory database that combines rich content with a user-friendly, fully searchable website that links directly to your OPAC.

Who is it for?

BookBrowse helps busy librarians stay on top of new books, while offering patrons an intuitive, interactive guide to their next great read.

How is BookBrowse different?

BookBrowse focuses on depth, rather than breadth. Instead of an all-encompassing database with a *little* information on *a lot* of books, BookBrowse culls the best from the rest to help guide readers to the books they'll love. More than just an RA service, BookBrowse publishes four online magazines a month, packed with original content about recently published books. Unlike many others, BookBrowse does not accept paid editorial placement.

Is BookBrowse new?

Over the past decade, BookBrowse.com has become one of the most popular internet destinations for booklovers. Now, BookBrowse for Libraries offers remote and in-library access to its premium subscription services for one low cost.

Key Features

Browse or Search: BookBrowse provides flexibility for different user preferences. Patrons can cross-reference over 70 genres, time periods, and themes, with over 4000 permutations. Patrons can also search over 5000 of the best books of the past decade by title, author, or keyword; or browse recent issues to find the latest books.

Readalikes: BookBrowse offers more than 8,000 readalikes from more than 2,000 books, with more added every week. All readalikes are made by people, not by computer algorithms, and frequently link between different genres and between fiction and nonfiction. Readalikes are made with both the author's writing style and the book's themes in mind, to reflect the way we really read.

Complete Book Information & Media Reviews: Every featured book includes jacket copy, an excerpt, and a range of media reviews from leading publications. Each review is abbreviated to the reviewer's essential opinion to minimize plot spoilers and repetition, and an overall consensus rating is applied to each book.

Reader Reviews: Over 18,000 consumer reviews, with more added everyday. Library patrons may rate and review books

Resources for Book Clubs: Extensive resources for book clubs, with book recommendations, advice on setting up and running a book club, reading guides, and author interviews. Reading guides can be searched by genre, time period, setting or theme. In addition, patrons and librarians can invite well-known authors to chat with their book club in person or by phone through our "Invite the Author" program.

Tailored for Your Library

Remote Patron & in-Library Access: BookBrowse can be accessed both within your library (usually via IP recognition so that no login is required) or remotely. BookBrowse supports libraries that remotely authenticate their patrons and those that don't.

One-click Links to your OPAC: BookBrowse can dynamically link to your OPAC so that patrons can check the availability of any book they find at BookBrowse with one click.

Usage Stats: Counter-conformant usage reports, accessible to librarians via login, record sessions, searches and page views. Stats are updated daily and broken down by month.

Emails Personalized for Your Library: Patrons and librarians can opt to receive an email every time a new online-magazine is published. Emails are branded for each library and contain a link to the appropriate login page for the specific library, making it quick & easy to access. BookBrowse has never and will never sell or rent its mailing lists. Emails are ad-free and opt-out is with one click.

Website Customized for Your Library: Each page of BookBrowse is customized for your library: "BookBrowse for Libraries - brought to you by Anytown Library."

Getting the Most Out of BookBrowse: Communicating the availability of your services is key to usage. BookBrowse provides a range of materials to help, such as high quality counter cards and bookmarks, graphic links, and copy for press releases and your library's website.

Interactive Magazines

BookBrowse's online magazines are usually published 4 times each month. Issues are archived and searchable on the BookBrowse website.

"BookBrowse Recommends" (2x/month) features ~15 in-depth book reviews of recently published books, the stories behind the books, and book-related news stories. Reviews also include a back-story with interesting facts relating to the setting or writing of the book. In addition, wherever possible, we include a reading guide and author Q&A. Our in-depth reviews are original, and unlike many services, BookBrowse does not accept paid editorial placements.

"Interviews & Reading Group Roundup" (1x/month) summarizes recently featured author interviews & discussion guides with links to the full text. Plus tips and advice for book clubs.

"Previews" (1x/month) previews 60-100 (dependent on season) high profile and notable books publishing the next month, providing abbreviated reviews from all available prepub sources, including overseas reviews when available (over 350 reviews are summarized in an average issue). Advance lists tailored for librarians are downloadable in Excel and Word formats.
